State government and local lawmakers are key partners in providing high-quality, affordable, and accessible care to every patient.

#### **Support Connecticut Hospitals**

- Remove barriers to healthcare access by improving the state's Certificate of Need (CON) process
- Collaborate to address Medicaid underpayment and make healthcare more affordable and accessible
- Support telehealth flexibilities
- Oppose policies that would further strain hospitals, such as cost growth benchmark penalties, arbitrary caps on commercial payments, site-neutral payment cuts, and further restrictions on facility fees, which would reduce access to critical healthcare services, especially in underserved communities

### **Support the Healthcare Workforce**

- Continue collaborative efforts to stop workplace violence
- Bolster hospitals' recruitment and retention efforts to address the critical healthcare workforce shortage

# **Support Communities and Patients**

- Keep hospitals sustainable so they can continue contributing to strong economies and healthy communities
- Invest in behavioral health services and care
- Address unfair health insurance company practices, like burdensome prior authorization policies, that reduce access to care
